SUBJECT: Tuberculosis (TB) Testing Requirement in Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD) Facilities during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

PURPOSE: Provide guidance to AOD facilities required to TB test personnel and clients during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 9, Section 10564(e)(1), the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) requires that all personnel of AOD facilities shall be screened for good health, including *“a test for tuberculosis, performed under licensed medical supervision not more than sixty (60) days prior to or seven (7) days after employment with tuberculosis testing renewable every year.”* Additionally, CCR, Title 9, Section 10567(b) states, *“Every resident shall be tested for tuberculosis under licensed medical supervision within six (6) months prior to or thirty (30) days after admission and annually thereafter if continuous participation is maintained.”*

The Center of Disease Control Prevention (CDC) released new recommendations for preventing, reporting, and managing mRNA COVID-19 vaccine administration errors. Included in these guidelines are additional information and updated recommendations for those who plan to receive, or have received the mRNA COVID-19 vaccine, and also require testing for TB infection. According to the CDC, TB testing can be done before or at the same time as mRNA COVID-19 vaccination, or otherwise delayed for ≥ 4 weeks after the completion of mRNA COVID-19 vaccination.

POLICY:

DHCS recognizes the [Interim Clinical Considerations for Use of mRNA COVID-19 Vaccines | CDC](#) guidelines and encourages personnel and clients of AOD facilities to adhere to the CDC recommendations for TB testing during the COVID-19 public health emergency.

If TB testing is delayed as a result of complying with the CDC's guidelines for the mRNA COVID-19 vaccination, personnel and clients shall provide the AOD facility with their COVID-19 vaccination record for purposes of verifying their health status in accordance with 9 CCR §§ 10564 and 10567.
